Our members are recent immigrants, workers of colour, women, youth and workers in unstable and low-paid work. Many of us work as temps, are on contract or set up as independent contractors. One week we may be juggling 2 or 3 jobs while next month there is no work or income. When we are able to find work, there is little protection if we are not paid or face unfair conditions.

The Workers' Action Centre provides a way for people to join together to fight for fair employment and wages. We believe that people who are directly affected by poor working conditions should be providing leadership in our struggle for fairness and dignity at work.
